
Monthly Report 2021-22 11 July to 10 August 2021



ended on a very informative and positive note.





To acquaint our students with the board marking scheme and paper pattern the First Unit Test was conducted for classes 9 and 10 on Edusprint+ app and Google Classroom from


2nd-6th August which involved a combination of MCQs and brief answers.






