Annual Report

Bunts Sangha's S. M. Shetty Junior College has completed 16 fruitful years in the field of education. Since its inception, the college in its quest for excellence has been constantly reinventing itself to promote excellent standards in quality education.

Junior College offers education under two streams, namely, Science and Commerce. The college has strength of 1,694 from a humble beginning in 2003 with 146 students. In all, there are 31 qualified teaching staff, who work in collaboration with the non-teaching staff to achieve the vision and mission of the institution.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS (2018-19)

The HSC Board examination results show the academic progress of the Junior College students. In the year 2018-19 total number of students appeared in the Commerce stream were 521 and Science stream were 365. We have achieved **100 %** result in the Commerce Stream and **94.25%** in the Science Stream. Our students have brought glory to the institution and we congratulate all the academic achievers.

STATE-OF-THE-ART - INFRASTRUCTURE

We believe that good infrastructure is an out-and-out key factor in effective teaching and learning. We have well ventilated classrooms with Wi-Fi connection, state of the art library, well equipped laboratories, good cafeteria, full-fledged auditorium and a turf laid playground and student friendly ambience.

UPDATING THE DESIRED COMPETENCIES OF TEACHERS:

“Learning is a treasure that will follow its owner everywhere” and as teachers this is a pre-requisite. In our institution we continuously sharpen our saws by having excellent workshops, training programmes like;

- A hands-on training was organised on “Microsoft Excel” to Master essential Excel skills, formulas and functions.

- A Speech Competition “Youth Jagar” was organised as per the guidelines given by the Education Department of Maharashtra.
- Mumbai Police conducted an awareness program “Jagrut Mumbaikar” for the students to train students to be vigilant.
- A counselling session for the students along with their parents was conducted by a renowned Psychiatrist Dr. Harish Shetty to interact with the students to know about their problems towards life and studies.

ACTIVITIES TOWARDS UNLEASHING THE POTENTIAL

The more you praise and celebrate your life, the more there is in life to celebrate. A wide range of extra-curricular and co-curricular activities had been organized to bring out the innate talents and skills of the students.

- Dance workshop was organized for the students by a fitness trainer Mr. Ajinkya Thakur
- One-day-trip to Magic Mountain, Lonavala was organised for the students to develop social skills.

- Farewell Ceremony was organized for the XII standard students to bid adieu in a splendid manner. We wished them for their upcoming Board Examination and future endeavours.
- An Industrial Visit to Jerai Fitness Pvt. Ltd, Wada was organised for the Commerce students to get an understanding of the industrial process.
- A Visit to Ravi and Meena's Farm at Peth to meet Mr. Venkat Iyer (A techie-turned-farmer) was an enriching experience for the students to understand the benefits of organic farming & other farming related activities. They also got an insight in his life and developed a way of living with the ideology of back to the roots.

Introduction -

China has reported an outbreak of a new virus that has so far affected over 80000 with viral pneumonia, without any prior symptoms, which has led to more than 2000 deaths in the city of Wuhan. As per latest reports, the virus called novel coronavirus (nCoV) has also travelled to South Korea, Thailand, Italy, USA and Japan. Now in India also 38 cases of persons infected with corona virus are detected.

What is Coronavirus?

As a group of viruses that is zoonotic in nature, coronaviruses are transmitted between animals and people. In humans, the virus is known to cause respiratory infections that are typically mild but may become lethal as is happening in Wuhan of China.

Coronavirus Origin -

The nCoV has been suggested to have originated from a seafood market in Wuhan where wildlife was allegedly sold illegally. Looking at comparisons between the new coronavirus and its previous versions, scientists have suggested the virus started from snakes.

As per Dr Poonam Khetrpal Singh, regional director, WHO South-East Asia Region, though the new coronavirus being called novel coronavirus-2019, was not declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) by the Emergency Committee of the International Health Regulation which met last week, its risk was assessed to be 'high'.

Coronavirus symptoms -

Coronaviruses are a large family of respiratory viruses that can cause diseases ranging from the common cold to the Middle-East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) and the Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS). So far, the main clinical signs and symptoms reported include fever, difficulty in breathing, and chest radiographs showing bilateral lung infiltrates. However, not enough is known about the epidemiology of 2019-nCoV to draw definitive conclusions and the intensity of the human-to-human transmission, and the original source of the outbreak. In more severe cases, the infection can cause pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure and even death.

Coronavirus Treatment -

Scientists, researchers and doctors are working on studying the virus also known as 2019-CoV; however, there is no vaccine that can treat Coronavirus, since this is a new strain that had previously not been identified in humans.

Coronavirus Precautions -

The standard recommendations to prevent infection spread include regular hand-washing, covering mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing, thoroughly cooking meat and eggs and avoiding any close contact with persons showing symptoms of respiratory illness such as coughing and sneezing.

Hygiene -

Keep your environment clean at all times.
Wear a medical mask if any of the symptoms are prevalent.
Cover your nose and mouth while coughing and sneezing.
Wash your hands after contact with respiratory secretions.
Avoid close contact with anyone with cold and flu symptoms.

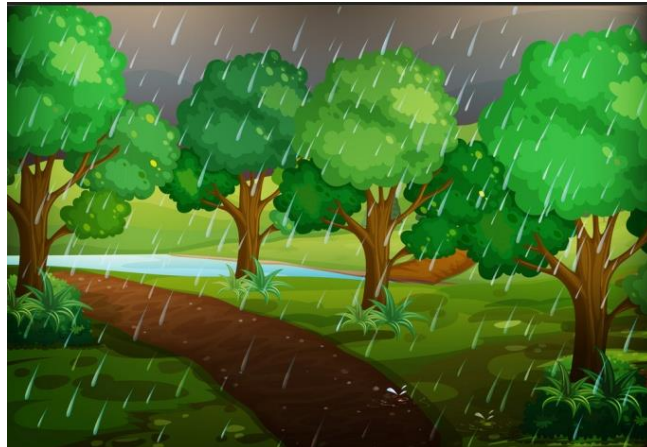
